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<p>Anagram—Scramble your letters and to make another word or phrase. Can a friend figure out your original word?</p> <p>(An anagram is a word or phrase formed by re-ordering the letters of another word or phrase, such as <i>satin</i> to <i>stain</i>).</p>	<p>Etymology—Find out where your words came from. Greek? Latin? French? You will need your dictionary to find out!</p>	<p>Poem—Write a short, two to four line rhyming poem for each word.</p>	<p>Story words - Write a short story using all of your words.</p>	<p>Ransom words - Write your words by cutting out letters in a newspaper or magazine and glue them on paper.</p>
<p>Similar? Different?--Find 3 synonyms and 3 antonyms of your word.</p>	<p>Titles—Create your own title for a song, movie, television show or book that uses one or more of your vocabulary words. Be sure to explain which one you chose. Example: The <u>Indignant</u> Princess: A story of Revenge—A book</p>	<p>Secret Agent Words - Number the alphabet from 1 to 26, and then convert your words to a number code. Be sure to have a friend decipher your code!</p>	<p>Words-in-words - Write your word and then write at least 5 words made from arranging the letters differently</p>	<p>Quotation—See if you can find something a famous person said with your word in it. Check out www.bartleby.com</p>
<p>Acrostic Poem— Write a poem using the letters of your word.</p>	<p>Haiku- Write a short poem using your word. (Line one: 5 syllables, Line two: 7 syllables, Line 3: 5 syllables)</p>	<h2 style="font-size: 2em;">Free Space</h2>	<p>Create an activity - Can you think of a fun way to do your spelling activities? Try it out!</p>	<p>Scrambled words -Write your words, and then write them again with the letters mixed up. Have a friend try to unscramble them.</p>
<p>Pyramid Words - Write your words adding or subtracting one letter at a time. The result will be a pyramid shape of words.</p>	<p>Magazine words - Use an old magazine or newspaper and find your word. Cut it out and glue it on paper.</p>	<p>Catalog Item—Pretend your word is in a catalog for sale. Write a great description and describe why someone should buy your word.</p>	<p>Haiku Comic Strip—Write a comic strip using 5 words in the first panel, 7 words in the second panel and five words in the last panel.</p>	<p>Sausage sentence—Write a sausage sentence using one or more of your words. (It's a meaningful string of words whose beginning and ending letters match. Example: (Tom <u>meets</u> Sam <u>moving</u> garages <u>slowly</u>.)</p>
<p>30 Second Words - Write a TV commercial using all the words from your list.</p>	<p>Tongue Twisters—Write a tongue twister using one or more of your words. (Remember, each word in your tongue twister must begin with the same letter or sound.)</p>	<p>Picture words - Draw a picture of your word's meaning.</p>	<p>Happy Birthday—Write your own lyrics to the <u>Happy Birthday</u> song using your words.</p>	<p>Comic Strip—Design a 3-panel comic strip using one or more of your words.</p>
