<p><b>Crossword</b>—Create a crossword puzzle using your definitions as clues. Give it to a friend to solve.</p> <p>(All)</p>	<p><b>Etymology</b>—Find out where your words came from. Greek? Latin? French? You will need your dictionary to find out!</p> <p>(All)</p>	<p><b>Poem</b>—Write a short, two to four line rhyming poem for each word.</p> <p>(All)</p>	<p><b>Story words</b> - Write a short story using all of your words.</p> <p>(All)</p>	<p><b>Ransom words</b> - Write your words by cutting out letters in a newspaper or magazine and glue them on paper.</p> <p>(All)</p>
<p><b>Similar? Different?</b>--Find 3 synonyms and 3 antonyms of your word.</p> <p>(1)</p>	<p><b>Titles</b>—Create your own title for a song, movie, tv show or book that uses one or more of your vocabulary words. Be sure to explain which one you chose. Example: The <u>Indignant Princess</u>: A book of Revenge</p> <p>(1)</p>	<p><b>Secret Agent Words</b> - Number the alphabet from 1 to 26, and then convert your words to a number code. Be sure to have a friend decipher your code!</p> <p>(All)</p>	<p><b>Words-in-words</b> - Write your word and then write at least 5 smaller words made from arranging the letters differently.</p> <p>(1)</p>	<p><b>Silly Song</b>—Can you write a song that uses at least two of your words? It can be silly, but it has to make sense!</p> <p>(2 or more)</p>
<p><b>Acrostic Poem</b>-- Write a poem using the letters of your word.</p> <p>(1)</p>	<p><b>Haiku</b>- Write a short poem using your word. (Line one: 5 syllables, Line two: 7 syllables, Line 3: 5 syllables)</p> <p>(1)</p>	<p>Free Space</p>		<p><b>Scrambled words</b> -Write your words, and then write them again with the letters mixed up. Have a friend try to unscramble them.</p> <p>(All)</p>
<p><b>Pyramid Words</b> - Write your words adding or subtracting one letter at a time. The result will be a pyramid shape of words.</p> <p>(All)</p>	<p><b>Sentence</b>—Can you use your words correctly? Write a sentence with each one.</p> <p>(All)</p>	<p><b>Catalog Item</b>—Pretend your word is in a catalog for sale. Write a great description and describe why someone should buy your word.</p> <p>(1)</p>	<p><b>Haiku Comic Strip</b>—Write a comic strip using 5 words in the first panel, 7 words in the second panel and five words in the last panel.</p> <p>(1)</p>	<p><b>Sausage sentence</b>—Write a sausage sentence using one or more of your words. (It's a meaningful string of words whose beginning and ending letters match. Example: (Tom <u>meets</u> Sam <u>moving</u> <u>garages</u> <u>slowly</u>.)</p> <p>(1)</p>
<p><b>Parts of Speech</b>—Use your dictionary to find out which part of speech your word is and write it next to your word.</p> <p>(All)</p>	<p><b>Tongue Twisters</b>—Write a tongue twister using one or more of your words. (Remember, each word in your tongue twister must begin with the same letter or sound.) (Also known as Alliteration!)</p> <p>(1)</p>	<p><b>Picture words</b> - Draw a picture of your word's meaning.</p> <p>(1)</p>	<p><b>Syllables</b>—Use your dictionary to find out how many syllables your word has and then divide your words correctly.</p> <p>(All)</p>	<p><b>Practice Makes Perfect</b>— Write each of your words five times each.</p> <p>(All)</p>
